How do we schedule a wedding in Old First's Sanctuary?

The first step is to contact the church office at 215-922-4566 or admin@oldfirstucc.org and speak with the church administrator. The administrator can answer any initial questions, as well as set up a time for you to visit our sanctuary. During that visit, we can begin to discuss any questions you may have about the event. If you then wish to pursue the possibility of holding your wedding at Old First, you will want to inform us of the specific date and time. If the date is available, we will save this date for you for one week, during which time we will need to receive a \$300 deposit and the wedding form.

Then, the church administrator will help you coordinate with the Pastor for an initial meeting. At this initial meeting, the Pastor will get acquainted with you and outline the preparation process for the wedding. Our Pastor will explain to you at that time how many additional meetings will be needed for pre-marital counseling.

Who officiates?

The Pastor of Old First officiates at all weddings. The Pastor acts as a representative of the church and gives the marriage the church's blessing.

How can others be invited to participate?

At your request, additional clergy may be invited to assist in the service at the discretion of the Pastor. Family and friends of the couple may also be invited to share in the service. All participants must be present for the rehearsal.

Seating Capacity

Our sanctuary seats approximately 300 and our sanctuary is air-conditioned.

Music

The music selected needs to be appropriate for sacred worship. At least two months before the wedding, the couple should have a meeting with the music director to discuss the selection of the music. The music director of Old First (or their designee) will play for all weddings. Exceptions may be made, but our music director must approve all guest organists and musicians.

Vocal or instrumental soloists often enhance the beauty of a wedding. Their music should be chosen in consultation with the music director. Please note that rehearsals with a soloist or an instrumentalist incur extra charges.

Photography

Photographs are permitted during the service. The wedding couple can determine who may take pictures of their special day.

Videography

Video cameras must use available light and be mounted on a stationary tripod. No more than two may be used: one may be located in the balcony, and the other may be placed in one of the side aisles.

Flowers

It is up to the couple to arrange floral decorations. The wedding coordinator will arrange a time with the florist for delivery on the day of the ceremony. As an option, some couples choose to leave the altar flowers for use in the Sunday worship, while others make arrangements to take their flowers to the reception. If the latter option is chosen the couple will need to make those arrangements. If the flowers are kept for Sunday, then we will add a prayer in the bulletin that they are “from the wedding of...” The church administrator and wedding coordinator will discuss these and other logistical arrangements with you.

Other Arrangements

If you would like a program for your service, it is your responsibility to prepare and print it. Our Pastor will work with you to plan the order of worship.

Pertinent information (usually the order of service and names of participants in the service and those in the wedding party) must be given to the church administrator in writing prior to the service.

The wedding coordinator will be present for both the rehearsal and the wedding. The Pastor will inform the coordinator of any special arrangements.

Our social hall is available to the wedding party one hour prior to the wedding. We can accommodate the wedding party with space for dressing or preparation for the ceremony.

For environmental reasons, rice and helium-filled balloons are not permitted at the wedding. Birdseed or bubbles may be used only outside.

Our social hall and the adjacent kitchen on the lower level are available for receptions. If you are interested in using it, additional fees will be charged. Speak with the church administrator if you are interested.

No alcoholic beverages may be served anywhere on the premises or in the buildings. Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the premises or in the buildings.
